Note: The <u>future progressive tense</u> (also called future *continuous* tense) describes actions which <u>will be ongoing</u> in the future. It can be formed using either "will be" + present participle (the -ing form of the verb) **or** "am/is/are" + "going to be" + present participle. Usually, in the <u>future progressive tense</u>, these two methods are interchangeable. Remember, that is *not* true in the simple future tense.
