
## The Desert



## I Ride

My name is Tess and I ride horses. I ride them in the circus. I ride them in parades. I ride them in shows. I am riding in a horse show today. My horse runs. My horse jumps. My horse dances. I hold on!


My horse is the best. I named her Twin. I feel like the horse and I are the same when I ride her.

My mother is not at the horse show. She has to work. But my father is there. He claps. He yells. He smiles.

The show ends. A man announces the winners. "First Prize goes to Tess and Twin!" he says. He gives me a blue ribbon. I am very excited.

My dad gives me a hug. "You won!" he says.

My dad and I go home. My dad tells my mom about my ribbon. She cries. She gives me a big hug. "Your hard work is showing," she says.

**Sample 2.1**
**1) B**
**Question Type: Inference**

At the beginning of the passage, the author writes, "Deserts are very dry places." Wet is the opposite of dry. If deserts are very dry, we can tell that deserts are not wet. This means **(B)** is correct. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)** or **(C)**. The author mentions that deserts are very dry and hot. Therefore these choices are incorrect.

**2) C**
**Question Type: Detail**

At the end of the second part of this passage, the author writes, "[Desert] plants can save water." This lets us know that desert plants can save water. Therefore **(C)** is correct. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)** or **(B)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

**3) A**
**Question Type: Global**

At the beginning of the passage, the author writes, "Also, deserts are very hot." If snake likes to rest in the sun, and we know the sun makes things hot, we can tell that snake would most likely live in a desert, which is hot. Therefore **(A)** is correct. In the passage, the author writes, "Deserts are very dry places. Deserts get very little rain." If fish likes to swim in the river, we can tell that the desert would not be a good place for her to live. This is because rivers do not flow in deserts that are very hot, dry, and get little rain. This means **(B)** is incorrect. The author never mentions that there are tall trees for climbing in the desert. This lets us know that if monkey likes to climb trees, he would not most likely live in the desert. Therefore **(C)** is incorrect.

**4) B**
**Question Type: Global**

In this passage, the author writes about animals, plants, and the environment called the desert. Scientists study animals, plants, and the environment. This lets us know that the author of this passage is most likely a scientist. Therefore **(B)** is correct. Teachers might teach this passage, but they are less likely to write about animals, plants, and the environment than scientists. This lets us know that the author of this passage is not most likely a teacher, and **(A)** is incorrect. Doctors do not typically write passages about animals, plants, and the environment. This lets us know that the author of this passage is not most likely a doctor. Therefore **(C)** is incorrect.

**5) C**
**Question Type: Detail**

In the third part of this passage, the author writes, "Deserts have special animals...these animals can hide in the sand when it is very hot." This lets us know that desert animals are special because they can hide in the sand. This means **(C)** is correct. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)** or **(B)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

**6) B**
**Question Type: Inference**

In this passage, the author writes about the desert. In the second part of this passage, the author writes that the desert has special plants that "can save water." This lets us know that if a cactus is a type of desert plant, it can probably store water inside its body. Therefore **(B)** is correct. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)** or **(C)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

**Sample 2.3**
**1) B**
**Question Type: Detail**

In the first part of the passage, the author writes, "A new pet shop opened up on Main Street." This lets us know that the new pet shop is on Main Street. Therefore **(B)** is correct. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)** or **(C)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

**2) A**
**Question Type: Global**

A good title summarizes the information in the passage and lets readers know what to expect should they read further. In this passage, the author writes about what two friends, Martha and Sam, see at the pet shop one day. This lets us know that A Day at the Pet Shop is the best title for this passage. Therefore **(A)** is correct. At the end of this passage, the author mentions that Sam bought a fish. Despite this, the author never mentions that Sam bought a fish tank. Even if he had, this would only be one detail from the passage, and it would not summarize the information from the passage. This lets us know that My New Fish Tank is not the best title for this passage, which means **(B)** is incorrect. The author never mentions that the pet shop is the best store in town. This lets us know that The Best Store in Town is not the best title for this passage. Therefore **(C)** is incorrect.

**3) B**
**Question Type: Inference**

In the second part of the passage, the author writes, "There was a brightly colored bird in the window." We know that bright colors attract our attention. Using this information, we can tell that the pet shop owner most likely put the bird in the window because he wanted to attract new customers. This means **(B)** is correct. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)** or **(C)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

**4) A**

**Question Type: Detail**

In the third part of the passage, the author writes, "Inside the shop, there was a large fish tank. The tank had many fish." This lets us know that the fish were located in the large tank. Therefore **(A)** is correct. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(B)** or **(C)**. This means they are incorrect.

5) **C****Question Type: Global**

In the passage, the author writes, "In the back of the shop, there was a small cage. There were furry, gray kittens in the cage." This lets us know that the sentence—Small, furry, gray colored kittens were in the cage.—best describes what was in the back of the pet shop. This means **(C)** is correct. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)** or **(B)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

6) **B****Question Type: Global**

In the fourth part of the passage, the author writes about kittens. In the third part of the passage, the author writes about fish. Since the author never writes about puppies, we can tell that a puppy was not in the pet shop. Therefore **(B)** is correct. Using the above information, we can tell that the author writes about kittens and fish. Since this means that a kitten and fish were in the pet shop, we can tell that **(A)** and **(C)** are incorrect.

7) **B****Question Type: Detail**

At the end of the passage, the author writes, "Sam decided to buy a fish." This lets us know that Sam decided to buy a fish. Therefore **(B)** is correct. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)** or **(C)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

**Sample 2.3**1) **A****Question Type: Detail**

In paragraph 1, Tess tells us that she rides her horse "in shows." This supports **option (I)**. Although horse shows may commonly be held at a school, the passage does not give specific information about where the shows are held. This eliminates **option (II)**. Horse shows could also be held on a farm, but the passage does not give specific information about where the shows are held. This eliminates **option (III)**. Therefore **(A)** is correct.

2) **B****Question Type: Detail**

In paragraph 1, Tess is at the horse show. Tess's horse runs, jumps, and dances. In order to do this, the horse moves quickly and in many different directions. To stay on the horse, Tess needs to "hold on!" Otherwise, Tess will fall off the horse. Therefore **(B)** is correct. **(A)** is incorrect because it is the horse who dances, not Tess. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(C)** and **(D)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

3) **D****Question Type: Detail**

At the end of paragraph 2, Tess tells us that "I feel like the horse and I are the same when I ride her." Tess means that she feels like she is part of Twin, or connected to her in a very close way. Choice **(D)** best reflects this idea. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)**, **(B)**, and **(C)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

4) **A****Question Type: Detail**

In paragraph 3, we learn that "My mother is not at the horse show. She has to work." Choice **(A)** provides this reason. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(B)**, **(C)**, and **(D)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

5) **D****Question Type: Detail**

In paragraph 4, a man announces the winners of the show, stating, "First Prize goes to Tess and Twin [Tess's horse]." According to the passage, the name of her prize is "First Prize." Therefore **(D)** is correct. Although Tess does win a ribbon, the ribbon is blue, not red. This means choice **(C)** is incorrect. The passage does not provide information to support choices **(A)** and **(B)**. Therefore they are incorrect.

6) **C****Question Type: Inference**

Although she does cry, Tess's mother is not sad. She cries because she is happy. We know this because she has reason to be happy, as Tess just won first prize at the horse show. This eliminates **option (I)**. In the final paragraph, Tess's mother cries and gives Tess "a big hug." She cries because she is happy; she is crying tears of joy. This supports **option (II)**. In addition to being happy, Tess's mother is proud. We know this because she tells Tess that her "hard work is showing." The "hard work" she is referring to must be the time she spends practicing to become a better horse rider. When someone is happy or satisfied as a result of the work someone else has done, that person is proud. This supports **option (III)**. Therefore **(C)** is correct.
