## Superlative Adjectives

An **adjective** is a word or phrase used to describe a noun or pronoun.

A **superlative adjective** is used to indicate that *one thing* has some feature to a greater or lesser degree than *all others* (in a given context). For example, if Bill is 45, Ted is 27, and Amy is 43, then Bill is the oldest in the group.

- To show an unequal comparison, you need to use an **adjective** followed by a preposition such as "**of**", "**in**", "**on**", etc. It may also be followed by the noun in which it is the greater or lesser. It may also be followed by nothing else when the context is implicit.
- For superlative adjectives with one syllable, add "est" to the ending.

[adjective + "est"] preposition
---------------------------------

**Example:** Anika is the tallest of the three sisters.
